- Seattle Parks came for the second visit.
- The Georgetown Playfield will receive funds from the Pro Parks levy. Currently the field is sand and silt. \$1.8M will be used to resurface it with a synthetic material: parks resurface fields that have lights so they can be used all year long, day and night.
